EIU LOCKS UP FINAL TOURNEY BERTH: Eastern Illinois clinched the final OVC Tournament berth Sunday with a 2-0 win against Jacksonville State. The Panthers needed at least a draw to clinch, thanks in part to Eastern Kentucky's 2-0 win at Tennessee Tech Friday. **Michelle Steinhaus** scored a pair of first-half goals in EIU's win, posting her second multi-goal game of the season and fourth career. The EIU defense took care of the rest, holding JSU to only three shots and no corner kick opportunities. The Panthers are slated to play at third-seeded Murray State on Nov. 6 in the tourney's opening round.

SAMFORD ENDS HOME STREAKS: Samford defeated EIU, 3-1, Oct. 26 in the final regular-season meeting between the two schools as OVC rivals. The Bulldogs ended a few notable EIU streaks in the muddy and rainy game. Samford became the first OVC team to score at Lakeside Field since Southeast Missouri on Sept. 29, 2006, ending a streak of five straight shutouts against league foes. That day also marked the last time goalkeeper Jenny Williams had conceded a goal (to any team) at home. Her consecutive scoreless minutes streak ended at 979. Lastly, Samford's three goals marked the first time EIU had surrendered multiple goals at home to an OVC foe since 2002 when Tennessee Tech scored twice. In fact, the three goals were also the most EIU had ever surrendered in an OVC home game.

STEINHAUS SCORES MORE: Michelle Steinhaus nearly posted the first hat trick by a Panther since 2003 in the Senior Day win against Jacksonville State. After scoring twice in the first half, a team save by a JSU defender was the only thing that prevented the senior from scoring that elusive third goal. Steinhaus recorded the first of her four career multi-goal games at home, scoring twice in a 2-0 win against Murray State in 2004. Her two multi-goal efforts since have both come on the road (at WIU in '04 and at EMU in the '07 opener). Her performance Sunday against Jax State, however, brought back memories of the first Senior Day game she played in. As a freshman in 2004, Steinhaus scored an overtime game-winner against Southeast Missouri. That win locked up a first-round bye in the OVC Tournament for the Panthers... With eight goals this season, Steinhaus has posted the highest single-season total by a Panther since she scored 10 as a freshman in 2004. Trisha Walter also had nine in '04, the most by a Panther other than Steinhaus.

WILLIAMS SECOND ALREADY: Goalkeeper Jenny Williams recorded her 12th career shutout in the 2-0 win against Jacksonville State. She has already moved into second place on the EIU all-time list. Nine of her 12 shutout performances have come against OVC foes.

STILL STINGY AT LAKESIDE: With EIU shutting out Tennessee Tech, Austin Peay and Jacksonville State at home this season, only three OVC teams have been fortunate enough to score at Lakeside Field since Oct. 1, 2005. Of the other nine league teams, only three – Southeast Missouri, Samford and Murray State – have scored at Lakeside Field. It's seems like no coincidence that those three teams finish 1-2-3 in the final league standings this season. SEMO and Murray both scored at Lakeside Field in 2006.

MILLER MATCHES FLOYD: Alexis Miller recorded her team-leading sixth assist of the season on Michelle Steinhaus' first goal against Jacksonville State. With nine career helpers, Miller has matched Kellie Floyd for the active lead among current Panthers. With Rachel Hamilton close behind with five assists, the two sophomores have become the first set of EIU teammates with five-plus assists in the same season since Steinhaus (6) and Trisha Walter (5) did it in 2004... The Southeast Missouri loss marked the first time Miller registered a goal and an assist in the same game. She's one of four active Panthers with such a performance on her résumé.

ALL SIX START ON SENIOR DAY: All six of EIU's seniors were in the starting lineup on Senior Day. Defenders **Karisa Brenner** and **Meghan Ryon** were the lone seniors to play the entire 90 minutes, but **Kellie Floyd**, **Kathleen Hayes**, **Michelle Steinhaus** and **Jenny Bock** all logged 70-plus... While **Laura Ridolfi** (vs. Samford) and Pam **Melinauskas** (vs. Jax State) started their first games of the season during the OVC weekend, **Rachel Hamilton** and **Lindsey Wilkening** came off the bench for the first time this season. Hamilton and Wilkening had both started the first 16 games before seeing action as reserves against Jacksonville State.

GOING THE DISTANCE: Defender Lindsey Wilkening left the field for the first time this season in the first half of the loss to Western Kentucky (game six), ending her team-long consecutive minutes played streak at 491. Meghan Ryon (401), Kathleen Hayes (357), Kellie Floyd (356), Jenny Bock (342) and Ashley Slota (265) have posted the other consecutive minutes played streaks of note this season... Slota leads the team in minutes played for the year, having been on the field for 1,497 of the possible 1,554 minutes this season. Hayes (1,428), Floyd (1,383), Wilkening (1,379), Ryon (1,267) and goalkeeper Jenny Williams (1,191) represent the other Panthers that have logged over 1,100-plus minutes this season. Among EIU players that have started less than half of the first 17 games, Bock leads the way with 908 minutes. Caitlyn Eisenhauer (823) has seen the most action of the freshman class.

NON-OVC OPPONENT UPDATE: A number of EIU's non-conference opponents are enjoying great seasons. Western Illinois (13), Western Kentucky (13), Missouri (12), Loyola (12) and Ball State (11) have all registered 10-plus wins thus far. Additionally, Mizzou continues to be nationally ranked and Ball State has cracked Soccer Buzz's Great Lakes Region Top 15. The Panthers not only defeated Ball State but also led both 13-win teams – Western Illinois and Western Kentucky – before the opposition rallied for a draw and win, respectively... In the OVC, meanwhile, Southeast Missouri and Samford both posted double-figure win totals, bringing EIU's total number of opponents this season with 10-plus wins to seven.

ROUGH ROAD TRIP: Eastern's final road trip of the regular season did not go well, as the Panthers dropped games at Tennessee-Martin and Murray State. Both losses represent the first EIU has ever suffered against either opponent. The loss at UTM ended on an overtime goal midway through the first OT. Each of the last two EIU-UTM meetings in Martin have ended with an overtime goal. **Kathleen Hayes** provided the heroics in EIU's 2005 win. Eastern was credited with putting 12 of its 15 shots on goal at UTM, but only one of 10 Sunday at Murray.

RUSK RALLIES FOR FIRST GOAL: Sarah Rusk scored EIU's lone goal on the Martin-Murray road trip, tying the game early in the second half with her first goal as a Panther. She's the third member of the freshman class to find the back of the net this season, joining **Angela Ziemba** and **Kaitlin Sullivan**.

OT DÉJÀ VU: The overtime loss at Tennessee-Martin on Oct. 19 was EIU's first in almost exactly a calendar year. The Panthers also lost in 2-1 fashion in OT at Samford on Oct. 20, 2006. Besides the final score, the two games were similar because the home team scored first, only to see EIU tie the contest to force overtime.

1-0 REEMERGENCE: The loss at Murray State marked EIU's first 1-0 defeat of the year. Earlier this season the Panthers also won in 1-0 fashion against Ball State. Arguably the most frustrating final score in soccer (especially for fans), Eastern's 1-0 games are way down this season. During third-year head coach Tim Nowak's first two seasons, the Panthers played in 17 games that ended with a 1-0 score – a remarkable 12 in 2005 and five more last year.

UNBEATEN STREAK VS. SEMO ENDS: Southeast Missouri posted its first win against EIU since 2002 Oct. 12, defeating the Panthers 4-2 in Cape Girardeau. The loss ended a six-game (5-0-1) unbeaten streak against SEMO. The four goals also represent the most EIU has ever allowed in an Ohio Valley Conference game.

BACK-TO-BACK FOR BOTH: Michelle Steinhaus and **Alexis Miller** both scored in consecutive games (Austin Peay and Southeast Missouri), accounting for all four EIU goals in the process. Steinhaus has scored in back-to-back games five times in her career, including a stretch of three straight during her freshman season. Miller, meanwhile, accomplished the feat for the first time as a Panther. Beth Liesen and Trisha Walter were the last set of EIU teammates to score in consecutive games. The two forwards both found of the back of the net in 2003 wins against Samford and Murray State.

PANTHERS POST FIRST BACK-TO-BACK WINS: Eastern Illinois shutout Tennessee Tech and Austin Peay during its first home weekend of OVC play, posting its first set of back-to-back wins this season. Ashley Slota, Kaitlin Sullivan and Pam Melinauskas each scored their first goals of the season in the Tech win, and Michelle Steinhaus and Alexis Miller provided the offense Sunday against Austin Peay. Eastern surrendered just two shots on goals in both games and enjoyed a 20-2 advantage in corner kicks on the weekend. Jenny Williams protected the net for 181 minutes of shutout soccer and did not surrender a goal, extending her impressive shutout streak at home.

EVERYONE PLAYS OVER FAMILY WEEKEND: Coach Nowak was able to get all 25 players on this year's roster some minutes during the Tennessee Tech-Austin Peay weekend. Twenty-four players saw action in both games. **AJ Brewer** was the lone Panther not to take the field against TTU, but made her home debut Sunday. **Kaylin Lorbert** was the only EIU player not to play versus Austin Peay.

SLOTA NAMED DEFENDER OF THE WEEK: After scoring the game-winning goal against Tennessee Tech and leading the EIU field players in minutes played (164), **Ashley Slota** garnered OVC Defender of the Week honors from the conference office. She scored her game-winner following an EIU corner kick in the 44th minute. The goal was remarkably similar to her first career score, the game-winner against Tennessee-Martin in last season's OVC Tournament opening-round win. Not only did she score both goals off a corner kick on the south end of Lakeside Field, but **Alexis Miller** recorded the assist on each occasion by putting the corner into play. The honor is the first of Slota's career. She's the first EIU player to win the Defender award since Lee Ann Langsfeld in 2005, and joins **Jenny Williams** as Panthers to capture one of the three weekly honors from the conference office this season.

STEINHAUS SCORES 10TH GAME-WINNER: Michelle Steinhaus' game-winning goal against Austin Peay was the 10th of her career, moving the senior into second place on the EIU all-time list. She enters the week as the OVC's active leader in game-winners. Steinhaus has also moved into fourth place on the overall goals list (with 25) and recorded her 50th career point with the game-winner against APSU.

NEVER SCORED AGAINST EIU: With the Panthers shutting out Eastern Kentucky and Austin Peay again this season, both OVC rivals have still never scored against EIU. The Panthers have shutout EKU in all three meetings and APSU in each of the six match-ups.

A QUARTET OF EARLY GOALS: The Panthers have scored in the first 10 minutes in four of their six home games this season. Michelle Steinhaus has down it twice, scoring in the fourth minute against both Western Kentucky (3:12) and Austin Peay (3:07). Kathleen Hayes (9:41 vs. BSU) and Kellie Floyd (9:03 vs. ISU) have also accomplished the feat. During head coach Tim Nowak's three-year tenure, Eastern has scored nine times in the first 10 minutes of a match. Hayes has recorded three of those eight goals. Alexis Miller scored the earliest goal last season (2:52 at Indiana State) and Sharyne Connell (2:11 at Loyola in '05) registered the fastest goal since Nowak became head coach.

ACTIVE LEADERS SCORE IN SAME GAME: Michelle Steinhaus (25) and Kellie Floyd (9) rank one-two among active Panthers in goals scored. However, the win at Eastern Kentucky marked the first time that the two seniors have scored in the same game. The Panthers feature a 23-3-1 record in games in which either Steinhaus or Floyd has scored during their careers. Floyd has found the back of the net in each of the three seasons that EIU and EKU have squared off.

FLOYD STARTS 50TH: Kellie Floyd started her 50th consecutive game in the victory at Eastern Kentucky. She has been in the starting 11 in every game since the 2005 season opener. **Ashley Slota** has the second-longest streak at 27. Slota has started every game in which she has played dating back to late in the 2005 season, and even then it took an injury to keep her out of the starting 11.

BRENNER BACK: Tri-captain **Karisa Brenner** was thought to be lost for the season after learning of a knee injury following the Missouri game. However, the senior was able to return to action during the EKU-Morehead road trip. She has played 583 minutes and started the Morehead, Tech, SEMO, Murray, Jax State and Samford games since her return.

DEUCES WILD: Erin Adams' two-goal effort in Morehead State's 2-0 win over the Panthers marked the third time this season an opposing player has scored twice against EIU (BGSU's Stacey Lucas and Mizzou's Alysha Bonnick are the others). Eastern has lost all three of those games. Conversely, the Panthers have won all three games when an EIU player – namely **Michelle Steinhaus** at Eastern Michigan and vs. Jacksonville tate and **Kellie Floyd** vs. Indiana State – has scored twice in a game this season.

STEINHAUS'S STREAK ENDS: Michelle Steinhaus saw her consecutive games started streak end at 26 when she came off the bench against Western Illinois. Steinhaus had started every game dating back to the '06 season opener. However, the senior has been back in the starting lineup since the beginning of OVC play.

EVERYBODY'S BEEN IN: With **Missy Faller** making her EIU regular-season debut in the first half of the Western Kentucky match, every Panther on the roster this season has seen action. Not only have all 25 players on the roster taken the field, but 21 different Panthers have started at least once. Freshmen **Caitlyn Eisenhauer**, **Danielle Flynn**, **Kaylin Lorbert**, **Sarah Rusk**, **Sophie Somers**, **Kaitlin Sullivan** and **Angela Ziemba**, as well as sophomore **Cassie Shear**, have all made their first career starts this season.

MILLER ASSISTS BOTH: Alexis Miller assisted on both EIU goals in the draw with Western Illinois, recording her first career multi-assist game. She set up Kathleen Hayes' goal with a well-placed corner kick to the far post. Kellie Floyd was the last Panther to post a multi-assist game, accomplishing the feat in the 2006 win at Jacksonville State. Floyd assisted on both EIU goals scored a school-record 19 seconds apart in the victory.

MORE ACTION FOR LORBERT: Kaylin Lorbert was selected to make her first career start in the loss to Western Kentucky Sept. 16, but was pressed into action during the Western Illinois-Loyola weekend due to an injury to **Jenny Williams**. Lorbert played well against WIU, making a season-high eight saves in the double overtime draw. She finished the weekend with 12 saves.

PANTHERS EARN SPLIT VERSUS FIRST-TIME FOES: Eastern squared off against Ball State and Western Kentucky for the first time in program history and came away with a weekend split, Sept. 14-16. The Panthers shutout BSU, the defending Mid-American Conference regular-season champs, Friday to finish the year with a 2-1 record against MAC teams. However, WKU overcame an early EIU goal en route to a 3-1 victory. **Kathleen Hayes** scored the game-winner against Ball State.

SHUTOUT STREAK ENDS: Western Kentucky's first of two goals in the 40th minute ended EIU's consecutive scoreless minutes streak at home at 829. The Panthers had not allowed a goal at Lakeside Field since Southeast Missouri scored in a 2-1 EIU win on Sept. 29 of last season. Western Kentucky became the first visiting team to score three goals at Lakeside Field since Illinois State in 2004.
